### GENERAL OVERVIEW

#### Description of University of Texas System The University of Texas System is comprised of 15 institutions of higher education with campuses across the State of

Texas whose missions are devoted to world class healthcare, teaching, research, and public service (collectively, "UT System"). UT System currently has six health institutions and nine academic facilities, making it one of the larger education systems in the United States. With an operating budget of \$12.8 billion, UT System has a current student enrollment exceeding 202,000. The Strategic Sourcing Team assembles a team of subject matter experts ("SMEs") from each participating institution to assist in the development of each sourcing event and the evaluation of

Objective of this Request for Proposal UT System, acting through the Alliance, is soliciting proposals in response to this RFP from qualified suppliers, for a

## throughout this RFP and in Section 5.4 (Scope of Work) of this RFP in particular (collectively, the "Services"). The

successful Proposer(s) to whom business may be awarded is referred to in this RFP as the "Preferred Supplier." SIEM is an enterprise solution for aggregating, correlating, and analyzing security event data in real time. SIEM solutions help security professionals identify and promptly respond to threats, demonstrate compliance with regulatory requirements, and perform sophisticated forensic activities. As a technology, SIEM provides real-time monitoring and historical reporting of information security events from multiple areas (i.e. networks, servers, systems, applications, etc.). Events are displayed on a centralized management console, providing a single point-of view from which it is easier to spot trends and see patterns that are out of the ordinary. Many firms have deployed SIEM as a method to address regulatory compliance reporting requirements, in addition to using it as a mechanism in which to build a robust information security operation, integrating the SIEM into their security management and incident response areas. For the purposes of this RFP, the scope of opportunity includes UT System Administration, The University of Texas Investment Management Company ("UTIMCO"), the (9) UT System academic campuses, and the (6) UT System health institutions. Section 5.4 of this RFP), the desired solution will need to have the capability of scaling from an initial small implementation, to a larger, more comprehensive solution. However, as a point of reference, for the purposes of gauging the scope of the required solution, please consider the Events per Second ("EPS") data from The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston (UTHSC-H). UTHSC-H would be considered a mid-sized entity, having 10,000 EPS. UT System makes no guarantees of these estimated figures, and offers this information only to assist you in preparing your proposal.
